Thank you for submitting your coin to PriceThatCoin.com.

We examined your photographs. In our professional opinion, the coin pictured is:

#1. An authentic 1943-P Lincoln Cent.

#2. This appears to be a minor mint error coin. Your photographs (rated 3 / 10, 10 perfect, 1 poor) are insufficient for determining grade and authenticity. If you submit four clear, sharp photographs within 48 hours as we originally requested, we are happy to re-evaluate.

#3. Current Market Value (2/5/2019)

This coin has a value of between \$2 - \$30+. Uncertified, the coin has a maximum value of \$1. Were you able to get it certified as a mint error, the value would likely be 25 – 75% over the value of the grade. The coin's grade is impossible to determine based on the photographs. Your best shot at error certification is ANACS, but you might get lucky with NGC or PCGS.
